gegenwärtig findet sich eine Vielzahl von Fernsehserien, die scheinbar anders konzipiert sind als je zuvor und die als zukunftsweisend betrachtet werden können. Zuletzt wurde mit der Serie *Lost* (ABC 2004-2010) eine Weiterentwicklung seriellen Erzählens sehr deutlich erkennbar. Eine innovative Transformation des medialen komplexen seriellen Erzählens evoziert eine neue US-amerikanische Fernsehseriengeneration. Doch was macht den Unterschied zur konventionellen Form der Fernsehserie aus? Ausgehend von diesen aktuellen Veränderungen erfasst Christine Piepiorka in ihrer Studie systematisch die Neukonzeptualisierung seriellen Erzählens unter dem von Jason Mittell geprägten Begriff *narrative complexity* und diskutiert die Implikationen dieses Seriengenerationenwechsels als Paradigmenwechsel der Selbstinszenierung des Fernsehens und damit des Selbstverständnisses des Zuschauers. Piepiorka arbeitet spezifische Charakteristika heraus, die besondere Bedeutung des visuellen Stils, einer paradoxalen Zeitstruktur, der vernetzten Handlungsebenen, der Selbstreferentialität und das einschneidende Merkmal der transmedialen Ausfaltung eines narrativen Universums über die Fernsehgrenzen hinweg. Ihr gelingt es damit überzeugend, eine Poetik der neuen televisuellen Erzählformen zu entwickeln. Auch mit den Implikationen dieser narrativen Verschiebungen auf eine fällige Neukonzeptualisierung des Zuschauers setzt sich Piepiorka eingehend auseinander. Ein Zuschauerverhalten, das zu einer Aufhebung der binären Position Medientext und Konsument und zu einer Partizipationskultur führt, in der Zuschauer als Ko-

produzenten des transmedialen medientextes rekonfiguriert werden sie verweist dabei exemplarisch auf die serie lost die den effekt der auflösung traditioneller erzählstrukturen und zuschauerkonzepte mit der metaphor des sich verlierens umreißt lost in narration

linda hutcheon in this original study examines the modes forms and techniques of narcissistic fiction that is fiction which includes within itself some sort of commentary on its own narrative and or linguistic nature her analysis is further extended to discuss the implications of such a development for both the theory of the novel and reading theory having placed this phenomenon in its historical context linda hutcheon uses the insights of various reader response theories to explore the paradox created by metafiction the reader is at the same time co creator of the self reflexive text and distanced from it because of its very self reflexiveness she illustrates her analysis through the works of novelists such as fowles barth nabokov calvino borges carpentier and aquin for the paperback edition of this important book a preface has been added which examines developments since first publication narcissistic narrative was selected by choice as one of the outstanding academic books for 1981 1982

the early english impersonal construction aims to demonstrate that an understanding of the functional and semantic aspects of impersonal verbs in old and middle english can shed light on questions that remain about these verbs today

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
